2017 was another fantastic year for Employment Horizons (EH). As always, our Annual Report gives just a small glimpse into the excitement of daily life here at EH. Our charts and statistics can never accurately convey the importance of placing someone at their dream job, a program participant learning a new skill, developing a new long-term business relationship, or the program participant who can afford to take a vacation, buy a car, or attend a college class all because of their job. This Annual Report also cannot convey the importance of supporters like you who have donated; attended fundraising events; employed program participants in your businesses or utilized our business services; called and written politicians on our behalf; participated as trustees, committee members, or volunteers; or provided grant funding. Our ability to help more than 400 people with disabilities a year find and keep meaningful work requires a massive effort that can only be successful when the community supports us, and more importantly, our program participants.


As always, we are so appreciative of your support, and did our best to be good stewards of your financial assistance. Again this year, more than 95 cents of every dollar donated went directly to programs and services. Many of the valuable programs we provided are underfunded by the government, and would be impossible to provide without your generosity. We can also proudly say that 76% of our revenue this year was generated by our business services. This is not only a good sign regarding the strength of our commercial work for our government and corporate partners, but is indicative of the 120 people employed on our external contract work, more than 120 individuals employed in our fulfillment center, the wages earned by these individuals, and the ability to support our non-profit mission through the revenue earned.

In 2018, we look forward to continuing to expand our business services with new commercial partners, opening our new Education Initiatives program including our home health aide training, continuing to look for other services we can provide to our program participants and their families, all while maintaining our current quality programs for which we've become known over the past 60 years.



For over 60 years, Employment Horizons has assisted people with disabilities and other barriers to employment to train for, find, and keep their dream jobs. Our committed employees have assisted thousands of people to find meaningful work. These achievements have been made possible by the generous support of donors, volunteers, committee members, and trustees.

The agency everyone now knows as Employment Horizons was founded by a thoughtful and forward-thinking group of parents. Their original program, with some updates and edits, still exists today as our agency-based fulfillment center. We proudly continue to operate that program, now in conjunction with supported employment, culinary training, janitorial training, and contract commercial services. This combination of services allows us to help those at any step of the employment process. Individuals can train for new jobs; work in our fulfillment center or on a commercial contract; and receive assistance to obtain, learn, and maintain employment in the community.

As we pass this milestone anniversary, Employment Horizons continues to provide the high quality services just described, while expanding into new areas to be able to assist an even greater number of individuals. We're grateful for your support as we look forward to the next 60 years!

Fulfillment Services



- 158 jobs performed for a customer base including Fortune 500 companies, multinational corporations, and regional and local businesses
- Program participant earnings increased 13% over 2016
- When surveyed, 100% of customers would recommend Employment Horizons to other businesses

Culinary Arts

- A successful "Taste of Spring" event that included 7 chefs from area restaurants and 125 attendees, raising close to \$14,000 for our Culinary Arts Training Program
- Raised over \$6,000 through the Paul Harrington Memorial Fund
- Year two of a \$100,000 four-year grant provided affordable lunches and ongoing training opportunities
- 17 trainees were assessed and 9 new trainees were enrolled in culinary training
- Served approximately 6,000 lunches for the year



Commercial Services



- •More than \$1.3 million in program participant earnings at Picatinny Arsenal
- •78 people with disabilities assessed, trained, and/or employed
- Added 4 new janitorial contracts
- Began our new Custodial Certificate Program at Picatinny Arsenal

Career Development/Staffing Services

- 32 new employers for the year including Mayo Performing Arts Center and Wegmans
- 25% of people served have multiple disabilities
- 64 placements representing 26% increase in placements from previous year
- 19% of employed program participants were promoted or assigned increased responsibilities
- 100% of employers surveyed would use Employment Horizons' services again



Agency Achievements

- \$.95 of every dollar went to agency programs and services
- 82% of total agency revenue self-generated through business sales, donations, fundraising, and foundations/grants
- Over \$3.4 million in program participant earnings
- Over \$600,000 in taxes paid by program participants
- With grant funding, purchased an MV-I vehicle built specifically to transport individuals who are wheelchair users, opening our Discover Your Community trips and other services to all program participants

Vocational Rehabilitation and Evaluation Services

- 136 people with significant disabilities were working 18-25 hours/week earning income
- 50% of trainees participated in community-based exploration and job samples
