Next-Level Warehouse Efficiency, Powered by the Lipari Family Foundation

Thanks to the generous support of the Lipari Family Foundation, Employment Horizons has made significant strides in enhancing its warehouse operations. The foundation's funding has allowed us to purchase two new pallet jacks, which are already making a remarkable impact on the efficiency of our Fulfillment Center.

One of the key upgrades is an electric pallet jack, which has significantly eased the lifting of the heavier items. This upgrade reduces the physical strain on our team, speeds up our operations, and allows us to handle larger volumes of work with greater ease. Additionally, we've introduced a skinny pallet jack designed explicitly for smaller pallets that our regular-sized pallet jacks cannot manage. This added versatility enables us to handle a broad range of tasks more efficiently.

Sam Castro, Director of Fulfillment and Facilities, shared his gratitude: "We are

incredibly thankful to the Lipari Family Foundation for their support. The new pallet jacks are a game-changer for us. They have helped to streamline our warehouse operations and have opened up exciting new opportunities for future projects."

These upgrades have already proven invaluable as we've secured several new fulfillment partners, with some shipments now weighing up to 3,000 pounds per pallet. Our program participants are eager to take on new projects in the Fulfillment Center, and we are optimistic that these new tools will help us expand our capacity and secure additional opportunities.

A big thank you to the Lipari Family Foundation for their generous contribution, which continues to impact our operations and program participants positively.
